Zip Code Targeted Programs

The Targeted Zip Code Spay/Neuter Projects focus on owned, stray, and feral cats in the targeted area, providing a free spay or neuter surgery and rabies vaccination.

Feral Freedom Program

TRAP • NEUTER • RETURN (TNR)

As of August 1, 2008, any feral cat brought to Jacksonville Animal Care & Protective Services, will no longer be euthanized at the tax payers' expense. Instead, these cats will be processed through the Feral Freedom program sponsored by FCNMHP. Each cat will be vaccinated, spayed or neutered, ear tipped (the universal symbol of a sterilized feral cat), treated for fleas and ear mites and returned to its territory within a matter of a few days.

Low-Cost Spay/Neuter

FCNMHP low-cost spay and neuter program is open to anyone. Surgeries are discounted and available through our spay/neuter clinic, located in the Joseph A. Strasser Animal Health And Welfare Building.

Wellness Care

Low-cost vaccinations, microchipping, flea and heartworm preventatives and a variety of tests are available. No appointments are necessary! Dogs, cats, puppies, and kittens are welcome. FCNMHP Wellness Clinic is open Tuesday through Saturday 10 am to 6 pm.

First Coast Pet Food Bank

WHY T•N•R?

Studies have proven that **trap-neuter-return** is the only successful method of stabilizing and eventually eliminating feral cat colonies with the least possible cost to local governments and residents, while providing the best life for the animals themselves.

SPAYING/NEUTERING HOMELESS CATS:

- Stabilizes the population at manageable levels
- Eliminates annoying behaviors associated with mating
- Is humane to the animals and fosters compassion in the neighborhoods
- Is more effective and less costly than repeated attempts at extermination—costs for repeatedly trapping and killing feral colonies are far higher than promoting stable non-breeding colonies in the same location
- Trap and removal does not work because vacated areas are soon filled by other cats who start the breeding process over again.
