To prevent overpopulation, FCNMHP provides low-cost and free spay/neuter surgeries at one of the nation's largest spay/neuter clinics. In addition, FCNMHP has programs to reduce the number of shelter deaths and keep pets in homes and

As part of your estate planning, you should have a power of attorney that allows someone to act with respect to your financial affairs in the event you are unable to do so. Here is some sample language to share with your attorney to make sure that your pets are provided for:

In the event I am unable to care for my pets, my Attorney-in-Fact is authorized to transfer the pets to First Coast No More Homeless Pets, 6817 Norwood Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32208, phone: 904.425.0005, pursuant to the terms of its Pet Haven Program, and if I have not paid the fee at the time of enrollment, to pay the enrollment fee.

The mission of First Coast No More Homeless Pets, Inc. is to eliminate the killing of dogs and cats in our community.

Enrollment Fee

The enrollment fee is \$10,000 for the first pet and \$5,000 for each subsequent pet. If paid at the time of enrollment, we will take your pets if you become incapacitated or are otherwise unable to care for them.

You may also pay on a deferred basis through a planned gift. A planned gift can be:

- A bequest in your will or living trust
- Naming FCNMHP as a beneficiary of your life insurance or qualified retirement plan
- Naming FCNMHP as the beneficiary of a "transfer on death" bank or stock account

Should your pets not survive you, we hope you will provide that your gift will still go to FCNMHP to help other homeless animals.
