

# Highlights from Our 2014-2015 Fiscal Year

Dear Friends and Supporters,

It has been an amazing 13 years since I started First Coast No More Homeless Pets (FCNMHP) with the goal of ending the killing of dogs and cats in area shelters. Most exciting is that **we have reached our goal of making Duval and Nassau Counties no-kill communities**, and many of the surrounding counties are now focusing their efforts to increase the number of animals leaving shelters alive. In 2002 there were 23,000+ shelter deaths in Duval County; last year that number dropped to 781.

In Duval and Nassau our resources must be focused on sustaining the no-kill achievements. In addition, we will continue to help shelters throughout Northeast FL and Southeast GA save more lives. **Your help is needed now more than ever!** 

In the process of becoming a no-kill community, FCNMHP has, with your support, achieved some remarkable milestones along the way:

- » We have become one of the largest animal welfare organization in Northeast Florida with a 2015/16 budget of \$7 million, 66 employees and assisting more than 60,000 dogs and cats each year.
- » We operate the largest spay/neuter clinic in the country, performing more than 25,000 surgeries each year, with most targeted at pets that are most at risk of ending up in shelters.
- » We operate the largest veterinary clinic between Orlando and Atlanta, seeing more than 28,000 patients each year, many of which could not afford regular price clinics.
- » We host the most successful adoption events in the country with our MEGA Adoption events, that match between 700 and 1,100 new families with pets.
- » We will soon open our second low cost veterinary clinic, where we expect to assist up to 300 people daily with their pets.
- » We have collaborated with local animal welfare groups and have formed the **Northeast Florida No-Kill Coalition** covering 12 Florida counties, and next year we will form a **Southeast Georgia No-Kill Coalition**.

Both the progress we have made in changing animal welfare in Northeast Florida and the growth of our organization has been amazing, and **your support has made it all possible. THANK YOU** for what we have accomplished together.

Although we have made great progress, there is still so much work to be done, with animals still dying in shelters across the country. We cannot rest until all of them are safe. With your continued support we will accomplish even more in the next thirteen years!



This year we made a significant push to open our new clinic. As we increase our reach to save even more lives, your support and funding become even more important.



# **Our Mission Progress**

This year, we performed 26,272 spay and neuter surgeries. While shelter intake increased this year, **euthanasia hit an all time low of 781**. Jacksonville and Nassau counties were, for the second year in a row, no-kill (defined as a 90% or better live release rate).



# **Our Targeted Spay/Neuter Programs**

Our targeted spay/neuter programs identify segments of the community (geographic, demographic or animal specific) that have a critical need for free spay and neuter services, based on factors such as shelter intake and euthanasia data

These programs also include **Feral Freedom**, a trap-neuter-return (TNR) program for feral cats from Duval, Nassau and Clay county shelters. This program has been emulated in communities across the nation.

# **Programs and Projects**

#### Teaching Animals and Inmates Life Skills (TAILS)



In partnership with Jacksonville Animal Care and Protective Services, the Florida Department of Corrections and the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, FCNMHP developed a program placing hard-to-adopt shelter dogs in four Florida prisons.

The inmates train, socialize and care for the dogs for approximately 10 weeks to ready them for their new forever homes. These programs were so successful that we were able to hand them off to two

well-qualified organizations, Pit Sisters and Lake City Humane Society.

# The Mary Lou Russell Animal Welfare Complex Including the Joseph A. Strasser Veterinary Medical Center

Our new low-cost veterinary clinic is in the final stages! Once open in 2016, we eventually hope to see **250 to 300 clients a day**.

It will be a full service clinic open seven days a week located at 464 Cassat Avenue in Jacksonville—an underserved area of town.

Not only will this clinic provide the same high-quality, low-cost care as our current clinic, but the revenues for the clinic will help support our other lifesaving programs.

There are still naming, sponsorship, and memorial tile opportunities available for the new clinic.

As of the end of this fiscal year, FCNMHP held 11 MEGA Adoption events, bringing together homeless pets from shelters across NE Florida and numerous other rescue groups.

These are among the largest weekend adoption events in the country and have saved the lives of more than 9.800 homeless dogs and cats since 2012!

This year we also added three weekend SUPER Adoption events, which were smaller and held at local PetSmart Stores throughout the NE Florida. They are focused on helping shelters better manage their populations between MEGA events. Our combined adoption events have saved more than 10,000 lives!

# Keeping Pets in the Home...

#### Jacksonville Pet Food Bank



Since March 2010, the **Jacksonville Pet Food Bank** has given out more than 1,000,000 pounds of pet food to more than 10,000 pets!

The food bank relies almost solely on community donations and volunteers. Pet food is distributed several times a year to qualified, low-income families whose pets are

spayed or neutered. Families who qualify for free food also qualify for free spay and neuter surgeries. This program helps keep pets out of shelters.

# Sulzbacher Center Partnership

We partner with the **Sulzbacher Center**, which houses more than 330 homeless people, many of whom have children and pets.

We arrange for temporary foster and medical care for their pets while they are getting back on their feet.

#### Pet Haven

**Pet Haven** is a program for pets whose owners predecease them.

Should the need arise, we will take in the pets enrolled in this program, and nourish and care for them until we find them a new loving home.



#### Pets for Life

Our **Pets for Life** program is funded through the generosity of the **Elinor Patterson Baker Foundation**. It is a Humane Society of the United States program. We are working in low-income neighborhoods in Jacksonville, through outreach events and door-to-door visits. Our professional team advises people of resources available for their pets, including spay and neuter services. When transportation is a barrier to care, we provide it for families.



## ...and Out of Shelters

Last year we saw **28,025** clients at our veterinary clinic located in the Joseph A. Strasser Animal Health and Welfare Building. Since 2009, we have treated more than 100,000 animals in need of veterinary services.

We provide standard veterinary care as well as emergency care at discounted prices. Our veterinary service cost is approximately 40% less than normal prices.

The money raised from the low-cost veterinary clinic helps to subsidize our other programs. We are excited that our new clinic, opening soon in 2016, will have the capability to serve three times as many animals.
